We're bringing back some favorite speakers who inspired us at previous conferences, including bestselling author Steven James as keynote. We'll also have several first-time OWFI presenters and a few surprises. Whether you're a brand-new writer or an experienced professional, you'll find many opportunities to learn, network, and grow in your craft.

- **Conference Registration** begins Thursday at 5:00pm. The registration desk will also be open Friday and Saturday mornings. We accept walk-in registrations, but we recommend signing up in advance.
- **Thursday Evening Pre-Con**. Acclaimed author Christine Taylor-Butler returns to OWFI to lead our pre-con session, "The Writer's Journey: What's in Your Toolbox?" An extra charge applies. Full-time students may attend this session free as space allows.
- Friday and Saturday: Breakout Sessions, Pitches, and More! From marketing and legal issues to poetry, world building, and screenplays, we'll offer more than 35 sessions covering just about every aspect of writing. Some presentations are geared toward beginners and others target experienced writers, but you're welcome to attend any session you want. Our faculty members are experienced authors and publishing professionals who will be available throughout the conference to network with you.
- Got a manuscript that needs a home? Shop it to agents, publishers and editors during the **pitch sessions**. If your manuscript isn't quite there yet, get an expert critique from our **book doctor**, Mari Farthing. Between sessions, check out our **bookstore** or support OWFI scholarships by **bidding** on the gift baskets displayed in the atrium.
- Have Lunch with Bestselling Authors. Oklahoma author and teacher Bill Bernhardt will present our Friday lunch workshop, and keynoter Steven James will lead the Saturday lunch workshop. You must register for the box lunch workshops in advance. Grab your tickets early before they're gone.

Lunch is also an ideal time to get to know our speakers. There are several restaurants within walking distance of the hotel. Find a speaker and a few friends, and enjoy the fellowship.

What to Wear

The Great Gong Show

Get ready for a big, exciting and spectacular. Yes, it is the Gong Show. What is the Gong Show you ask? It is a panel of agents and publishers who will listen to anonymous pitches read by an Master of Ceremonies. If the pitch is good, everyone will nod and be impressed. If not so good, they have a hammer to hit the Gong standing behind them.

How do you enter your pitch? There will be a place set up at registration, a do it yourself station. Fill out the card, drop it in a box, you are now in the Gong Show. If your card is picked it gets read out loud for the panel. Come prepared with your genre/market (YA, middle reader, historical, western, memoir, etc), title and a few sentences on what your story is about. Pitches are anonymous, so leave off your name!

Ladies and Gentlemen, let the Gonging begin!



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Hotel Information

The 2016 Conference will be held at the Embassy Suites by Hilton Oklahoma City Will Rogers Airport, on 1815 S. Meridian.

A block of rooms have been reserved for May 11–15, 2016 at a rate of \$121 for one king bed or \$131 for two double beds, per night.

The special room rate will be available until April 22nd or until the group block is sold-out, whichever comes first. Booking a reservation from our site is simple.

- Reservations must be made online by April 22, 2016.
- Rates published are for single occupancy. An extra person charge per person may apply for 2 or more guests sharing the same guestroom.
- There is a 13.88 % per room per night tax.
- Payment for room and tax and all incidental charges is due in full upon check out. Payment can be made by cash, by certified check, or credit card. Hotel accepts American Express, Diners Club, Discover Card, Duet Card, Eurocard, JCB International, Maestro/Switch, Master Card or Visa.
- If you wish to cancel, please do so 72 hours before arrival to avoid cancellation penalties.
- A limited number of rooms for guests with special needs, in accordance with ADA, are available. Please contact the hotel reservations department to confirm your arrangements.
- At check in, the front desk will verify your check-out date. Rates quoted are based on check-in date and length of stay. Should you choose to depart early a departure fee will be charged.
- We reserve the right to cancel or modify reservations where it appears that a customer has engaged in fraudulent or inappropriate activity or under other circumstances where it appears that the reservations contain or resulted from a mistake or error.



Book Room Guidelines

As in past years, there will be a "Book Room" available where books by attending authors and speakers will be available for sale, as well as a selection of books pertaining to the writing craft.

Due to a scheduling problem with the conference later in the month and other factors, we have a new bookstore retailer partnering with OWFI to operate the Conference Book Room. We welcome Full Circle Books of Oklahoma City, and look forward to a great weekend of book browsing and buying. Despite the change, the Room will operate much as it always has.

All OWFI members and conference speakers are eligible to participate. Authors who want their books available for sale must conform to the following guidelines.

Authors (or publishers) must notify Doug Kelley, the book room chairperson, by **April 11, 2016** of any title(s) they want included in the book room inventory, choosing one of the two options below. Due to limited space, non-speaker titles will be limited to 5 copies on display at any one time. Also, authors of multiple books will be limited to no more than 5 titles on display. (You may, of course, restock as sales warrant.)

Option No. 1: Full Circle Books will order your books from Ingram or other distributors or your publisher if they are returnable and the bookstore receives the standard retailer discount. Full Circle will not purchase books via the Internet. selfpublished books, or electronic books. (See Option 2 for books published by those methods.) Neither Full Circle or OWFI will assume responsibility for delays in shipment, short ships or publisher/shipper errors, although every effort will be made to alert authors of problems before the conference so other avenues of supply can be considered.

Option 2: Authors provide the books to be sold by Full Circle. Books will be sold at retail price, which will be provided by the author, along with quantity delivered, author name, address, and return shipping information. Of this retail price, the author will receive 70% and Full Circle Books will collect 30%. Those using this option should bring in their books to the book room starting Thursday evening (during Full Circle's set-up time) or Friday morning, or whenever you arrive at the conference. Unsold books must be picked up at the end of the autographing session Saturday afternoon. If the remaining books are not picked up, Full Circle or OWFI are not responsible for them.
