Staying On Top of Your Writing Goals During the Summer Slump



Contrary to popular belief, while many agents may close down their inboxes during the summer months, the industry as a whole does not "shut down," and neither should you. There are still plenty of things to do to stretch one's writing and submission muscles during the summer months, aside from—of course—writing.

Online contests are super popular these days, and

there are plenty of them that happen all year round, including now. Such contests are perfect for trying out your query letter or pitch. And if nothing comes of the contest itself, the networking opportunities are too good to pass up. Plenty of people have met critique partners and BETA readers during such events.

Another way to beat the Summer Slump is to take a moment to lay out your goals for the next few months. The changing seasons have an affect on peoples' mindset and lives. You feel more energetic, or you're tired of sitting around-did plenty of that during the winter-so you wanna go, go, go! Channel that energy. Set daily word count goals, or weekly ones. "Page count" goals work for anyone editing instead of drafting.

Set a deadline to finish this draft, or complete edits on that story by Independence day. Set a date for when you have to choose the story you're going to work on next from the dozens of



And while you're at it, be sure to schedule in time for fun and rest. Chances are a lot of writers spent the early months of this year editing the story they started during NaNoWriMo last year. Burn out is a serious thing so don't forget to take a break. It's okay not to think about writing every single second of every single day. Go to cookouts, take long walks, sit on the porch with a glass of icecold lemonade and finally finish that book.




Les Edgerton is the author of eight books, including the story collection, *Monday's Meal* and the writer's how-to, *Finding Your Voice.*, and Hooked: Write Fiction That Grabs Readers at Page One and Never Lets Them Go.

Les was born in Odessa, Texas, and grew up in a variety of places, mostly in Freeport, Texas and in and around South Bend, Indiana. Until he was in his forties, Les never lived more than two-three years in one place. He's settled down now, having lived in Ft. Wayne, IN for the past 20 years with his wife Mary and son Mike. He has two daughters—Britney Robinson who recently married Ray Robinson, and Sienna, married to Jason Cox. Sienna and Jason have given him his first grandchild, the ornery and cute-as-hell Logan.

He's had a fairly colorful life. After serving four years in the Navy, Les went on a bit of a wild streak, ending when he was sentenced to a 2-5 year sentence in Pendleton Reformatory for second-degree burglary. After being paroled, he went to school at Indiana University at South Bend, where, four years after getting out of prison he was elected Student Body President, was the sports editor of the campus newspaper, and head of the Student Athletic Association which began the school's first basketball team.

After that, he went on another years-long odyssey during which he (not in any particular order) sold and used drugs, worked for an escort service in New Orleans servicing older, wealthy women, sold life insurance, worked as a headhunter for a firm specializing in recruiting executives for firms dealing with electronic warfare, was a sports reporter, an award-winning hairstylist (cutting hair wasn't his dream in the third grade—he learned the trade in Pendleton) who won 16 state hairstyling championships and co-hosted a Cox Cable television show with wedding gown designer Paul Cimino on fashion in New Orleans (his first three books were on the hairstyling business and are still enjoying healthy sales), was homeless and living on the floor of a garage and eating out of a Big Boy's dumpster in Costa Mesa, California, made a television commercial and acted in a forgettable indie movie, went through several of his five marriages, collected white chips at A.A. meetings... and began writing seriously. Did some other stuff, some legit and some not.

Today, he's all respectable and such, and you can invite him into your home and when he leaves you don't have to worry about counting the silverware...
